

## **Objection to EIS Application No. 201700053**

We object most strongly to this proposal on the following grounds:

We understand it is illegal to build an enlarged railway siding in Fyshwick, a LIGHT industrial area.

There are big health risks with this proposal, both to the workers, other workers and shoppers in Fyshwick which includes us, and to nearby residents.

There will be an odour problem for nearby businesses and residents.

The traffic in Fyshwick and surrounds will become a nightmare, with 230 extra truck movements a day in an already congested traffic area.

The noise of those trucks with their air brakes will wake us up early and will go on no doubt into early evening. Those residents closer will be even more affected. I am a very light sleeper and my wife has a chronic disease and needs all the rest she can get. This will therefore affect the health and wellbeing of both of us.

There is an added fire risk, with associated toxic fumes.

Nearby Jerrabomberra Wetlands will be adversely affected, and could be ruined, just when it is starting to become a tourist attraction.

It will devalue our house, our biggest asset.

Why is this needed when we have a tip with 26 year's life left in it, which we are already paying for through rates? We will pay a lot more to a private company for the same work. There should be more work put into producing methane from Mugga Lane than some crazy idea like this. Also into encouraging people to recycle food waste, leaves even prunings at home. How about some government-sponsored demonstrations of compost making? I have been doing this successfully for the last 30 years- it's not hard.
