I have been watching and reading with great interest about the Capital Recycling Solutions (CRS) proposal because it potentially has a direct impact on our family business. My husband and I operate a subcontracting business for a large waste company that we cannot speak on behalf of and so shall remain nameless in this submission. We transport a range of waste materials and bins for the company that we work for.

We do not have any specific concerns about the CRS proposal, in fact it may even turn out to be a very good facility and it is certainly well located in our opinion. Our concern is the way that waste trucks are being characterised in this debate. I have read many of the public submissions and almost all of them refer to 'smelly garbage trucks'. We believe that this is an ill-informed perception and needs to be clarified for fear of having intended impacts on our industry. We urge community members to stop and look at a waste truck next time they see one passing through their street as they perform an essential community service. The days of the old rear loader trucks with the 'garbos' following have long passed. The modern ASL and front-lift trucks aren't the smelly, litter spilling offensive vehicles that many are suggesting they are. The truth is, we don't operate smelly, litter spreading vehicles and as a result of this important public debate, we do not need any further regulation of our industry.
