Dear Madam/Sir,

I wish to express my opposition to the proposal for a Waste Transfer Station (WTS) in Fyshwick.

I live in Narrabundah and I am concerned about:

- Particles vented unimpeded from the WTS. There is no Air Quality Study in the draft EIS despite an express requirement in the Scoping Document;*
- Odour from the WTS. The base of the vented plume seems to hover at low altitude according to CALPUFF and CASA modelling and may touch ground in adverse atmospheric conditions;*
- Approval for a WTS will provide leverage for an incinerator with all its particulate and toxicity problems. The belated denial by CRS of plans for the same is not believable;*
- Spurious, if not false, claims by CRS about an impending lack of space at the Mugga Lane tip and superiority of the Woodlawn energy generation system over that at Mugga Lane;*
- The ACT should keep control over its own waste processing and not become dependent on NSW facilities and NSW policies;*
- The ACT should advance a circular economy by all possible means, not jump head over tail into an adventure that will end with that dinosaur of a linear economy, an incinerator, or two, which might be highly profitable to CRS but a health disaster for the nearby community and the retail in Fyshwick will go out of business.*

I reject the CRS draft EIS in full.
