As a resident of Canberra's Inner South, I wish to provide comment on the proposed waste transfer station, just off Ipswich Street in Fyshwick.

This facility would have a significant effect on Inner South Canberra, a densely populated housing area, as well as many schools, children's care centres and aged care facilities. Also impacted would be all those Canberra and interstate residents who work and shop in Fyshwick.

Offensive odour from putrescible waste is likely to not only affect shoppers at the Harvey Norman store, the Fyshwick markets, and people living in Narrabundah and the planned Eastlake development and when the weather is windy much further afield across the Inner South.

Further, the addition of 230 trucks a day dumping waste in Fyshwick will significantly increase existing traffic congestion along Ipswich Street and Canberra Avenue. This is untenable in an areas where traffic has already increased dramatically with the growth of the Fyshwick area.

With the extensive unused lands of the ACT, there is no reason that this facility could not be situated in a more remote setting - away from populated areas. My suggestion is to think again more wisely on this matter.
