Please accept this submission on behalf of the Narrabundah College Student Environment Group. Although we appreciate and support the efforts of the Environment and Planning Directorate to reduce Canberra's waste and emissions, we strongly object to the 16 Ipswich St. Fyshwick CRS development proposal (#201700053), on the grounds of negative environmental and social impacts.

**Our major concerns:**

- The odour from the proposed development has the potential to disrupt nearby residents, retailers, school students/teachers, as well as the members of parliament at New Parliament House. We believe the development should not be located in or near residential and/or retail areas.
- We are worried that an increase in truck and rail traffic (which the development is contingent on) would have negative social and environmental impacts on the Narrabundah community as well as nearby suburbs, including increases to fossil fuel emissions, noise pollution and traffic risk.
- We believe that the ecological impact the proposed development could have on the Jerrabomberra wetlands, and species such as migrating avians, has not properly been considered.

Most of all, we believe that the community must be consulted regarding all major issues. We believe that regarding this development, this has not been afforded to residents of Inner South Canberra and local students. We believe that, based on the provided information, it is simply not feasible to develop a waste management plant of this size and reach at this site.
