Despite all the assurances by CRS about precautions to be taken with fire and odour, the most important aspect that is not given the prominence it deserves in the EIS is the likelihood that things will ultimately go wrong. The proponents admit during personal conversations that they cannot control all possible mishaps, but the picture painted in the EIS is misleadingly positive, especially the risk analysis sections. Traffic congestion is a further cost that will be imposed on the community, but the EIS does not even analyse its effect in terms of additional travel time imposed on users of Canberra Avenue and Ipswich Street.

It is unacceptable that one business should profit from an unsuitable proposal at the expense of local residents, Canberrans who shop in Fyshwick, and other businesses in the area.

The EIS and the proposal that it contains should be rejected.
