I am writing to express my serious concerns about the above proposed facility.

The draft EIS is totally inadequate in terms of its purported aim: that is an environmental impact assessment, of a proposal that would, in any case, be a poor outcome for that ACT, and particularly the residents of the inner south.

Some of the assertions in the, at times completely incomprehensible, draft EIS are at best misleading, and in other instances farcical.

The draft EIS fails to adequately and honestly address the inevitable impacts on air quality, including odour, traffic movements in the immediate vicinity but also on the main arterial roads to Fyshwick, noise (already an impact, at all hours, from the CRS block from current activities), operational risks at the site, and, importantly, the economic and public policy case for locating such a facility in Fyshwick.

It is clear on the CRS draft EIS alone that the proposal needs to be independently assessed with far greater rigour.

Fundamentally, however, the proposal represents a poor outcome for Canberra, and particularly residents in the area.

It is clear from CRS's prior representations that the end game is a tip in Fyshwick, for their economic benefit, and a waste to energy incinerator. It is hard to escape the view that this current proposal is part of a strategically incremental process of development applications, to in effect game the system, and the residents of the inner south and more broadly in the ACT, who have resoundingly voiced their concerns about CRS's proposals.

I look forward to a truly independent assessment of this flawed proposal.
