To whom it may concern

I am objecting to the application number EIS201700053 - CRS Materials Recovery Facility Fyshwick.

My main objections to this proposal are as follows:

- there is already an existing waste facility at Mugga Dump - there is no need to truck waste from there or elsewhere to process it at Fyshwick
- there will be unnecessary increased truck traffic as a result of the proposal which will be dangerous to all users of Fyshwick, will impact traffic flows, and degrade roads.
- Fyshwick is becoming a cultural environment with the opening of new businesses that provide amenity, places to eat etc and these will be greatly affected by this proposal
- we need a better plan in place to prevent such proposals being considered - put waste at Mugga and process it there. In any case we should be looking to minimise waste not bringing it into the ACT to process and then to truck it back out again. Let's be a smart territory not a stupid territory
- there are hidden costs in terms of environmental impacts, human impacts, business impacts and Government impacts - and undoubtedly many more.
- the proposed facility is a waste transfer facility - this goes against the philosophy of waste minimisation.
- the ACT does not need to be known as the waste capital of Australia - this is a huge reputation risk
- let's do something creative and rehabilitate the former Shell Depot into a green space - it can become an exemplar as to what is environmentally achievable

I trust that this proposal will be rejected and a sensible plan put in place for Fyshwick to develop as an amenity for the ACT.
